How did you mount it?

My upholsterer cut a plywood frame and covered it with antique green velvet. I chose that color to harmonize with the greens of my gardens. This is a very indoor-outdoor room, with French doors all around.

No, but it does give me the feeling that I'm away in some fabulous, exotic place. It's my vacation from my daily life.
